The meeting is open to everyone connected with the Friendship Project. Please come along to meet Older Friends, Group Supporters and the Management Team


The meeting is due to end at 12.00 and refreshments will be available.

### Pete's Corner

In the last issue of the newsletter I talked about statistics and applauded how the amount of children we are now supporting has grown over the last few months - at present it stands at 53 with another 11 in the process of being established. Obviously the more matches that we have the more it costs to maintain them. Our ongoing overheads are salaries that we pay to our key staff though these are way below their market value, insurance which is of course quite high as we are in a high risk business, and advertising to attract new volunteers and raise awareness of our project. Our other major expense is the monthly reimbursement payments to Older Friends for the cost of taking their Younger Friends out and any mileage this may incur.

The money for all of this comes from kind donations from individuals, organisations and companies and by our bidding into various funding pots like Children in Need and the Big Lottery Fund to name but two. Bidding into these requires much hard work by John Hancock, our chairman, and others. What they need most of all is evidence to submit to these bodies to demonstrate that we are making a difference to the lives of the children we support. In this respect you can help!

One of the requirements of being an Older Friend is that you were asked to complete a report each month outlining what activities you and your Younger Friend have done during the preceding month. This can then be used to support our bid - incidentally both Older Friends and Younger Friends names are removed before submission. Only 34% of Older Friends are at present sending in a report - you could assist the project in making successful bids by filling in this simple form. It can be downloaded from the projects web site at [www.FriendshipProject.co.uk](http://www.FriendshipProject.co.uk) and following the link to FORMS or if preferred it can be sent to me by email ([pete@FriendshipProject.co.uk](mailto:pete@FriendshipProject.co.uk)) if you are not submitting an expense claim.

Another way that we provide evidence to funders of the good work that we are doing is by way of a sample audit. This asks your Younger Friend's carer a few simple questions about the effect that our project is having on their child. If the carer of the child that you are matched with receives such a form please assist them in filling it in and returning it to me in the SAE provided.

I will finish my column for this time with a big thank you to Pauline Higginbottom who has been our Area Coordinator in the south of the county for quite a while now. Pauline has been amazingly dedicated to the project and she will be a hard act to follow - I hope we will be able to find her a less demanding role within the project very shortly.
