

Roy Edwards 1926-2009

Roy was Treasurer of the Stratford branch when it was formed in 1992 and became overall Treasurer of the Friendship Project in 1999 when the Stratford and Rugby Branches combined with the Warwick Branch (including Warwick University) and new branches opened in eaton/Bedworth and Atherstone.

Roy had impeccable credentials to be Treasurer as he was retired Account and Deputy Secretary of the Lichfield Diocesan Board of Finance. He became Treasurer of 7 other charitable organisations including Warwickshire St John's Ambulance.



Roy was a remarkable man who never complained even though he had battled with major medical problems for years. In his younger and fitter days he played hockey, football and cricket and maintained a keen interest in sport in later life. He enjoyed watching cricket at Edgbaston and following the progress of Birmingham City.

Along with his wife Margaret, Roy was very much involved in church life in the Small Heath area where he grew up as a boy. He will be remembered with great fondness by Margaret, Michelle his daughter, 12 grandchildren and members of the Friendship Project.

Testimonial from an Older Friend in Rugby

As I am self-employed and have a few hours at my disposal every week, I wanted to do something useful and productive with that time, and I chanced upon an advertisement for the Friendship Project.

Very soon I was paired up with a young lad whom I saw weekly for several months. Whilst the lad and I got on very well, and he developed socially over the time I spent with him, sadly his mother didn't totally endorse this programme as she had many other pressures and turned out to be quite obstructive and awkward, severely limiting the time I could spend with him every week and quite often cancelling without notice at all. As this was a waste of everyone's resources and time, the friendship inevitably was terminated by mutual agreement, and the family were given support from another agency instead, concentrating more on supporting the parents.

I was then matched with a delightful young lady, then aged 6. This association is all we both wished for; I have visited for 15 months now, with the eager participation of her mother, thank goodness, and we get on really well, free & easy, nattering away just like friends do. I am really pleased that after the initial disappointment we were able to find the right mix of participants and I hope we shall have a relationship lasting years, until she eventually feels she doesn't need this arrangement any longer.

I would urge anyone of a kindly disposition to try this programme - it can bring a terrific feeling of satisfaction, and we all enjoy helping someone really.
